





Fig.2 Maximum Safe Operating Area




Fig.3 Normalized Transient Thermal Resistance vs. Pulse Width





Fig.4 Single Pulse Maximum Power dissipation








#### Fig.5 Typical Output Characteristics(I)

Fig.7 Breakdown Voltage vs. Junction Temperature




Normalized Breakdown Voltage : V<sub>(BR)DSS</sub>




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
Fig.8 Typical Transfer Characteristics






Gate Threshold Voltage : V<sub>GS(th)</sub> [V]





### Fig.10 Forward Transfer Admittance vs. Drain Current






Drain Current Dissipation : I<sub>D</sub>/I<sub>D</sub>max. [%]

Fig.11 Drain Current Derating Curve







Fig.13 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Junction Temperature




Fig.14 Static Drain - Source On - State






Fig.15 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Drain Current (II)




Fig.19 Dynamic Input Characteristics

Capacitance : C [pF]





Fig.20 Source Current vs. Source Drain Voltage

Fig.1-1 Switching Time Measurement Circuit




Fig.2-1 Gate Charge Measurement Circuit




Fig.3-1 Avalanche Measurement Circuit




Fig.1-2 Switching Waveforms






Fig.2-2 Gate Charge Waveform



#### Fig.3-2 Avalanche Waveform





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
